## Technology:

**Laptops:** are to be charged and to only be used for school work.

**Cellphones:** are to be placed in your assigned number slot with notifications turned off unless given permission from teacher.

## **Grading:**

Instruction: Classwork, homework, labs, quizzes, tests.

**Late assignments:** Late assignments will be accepted if due to circumstances already made aware by the teacher. Students will lose 10% of their earned grade per school day after the due date.

Example: You earned a 85% on your paper. The due date was Monday but you turned it in on Wednesday. Your new grade would be 65%.

**Participation:** You will get participation points daily by showing up, working, and following directions. This will be 25 pts a week. EASY points if you do what you are asked.

#### Ways you can lose partial or full participation points:

- Being late to class
- Being disrespectful
- Horseplay in the shop or lab
- Coming unprepared to class
- Not working on the project during designated work time
- Being on phone without teacher's approval.
- Any other actions that may distract from the learning environment

#### Grades for absent work:

Students are responsible for the work they missed when absent. Students can pick up their work that they missed from their folder that is in the filing cabinet.
